



At school we love reading! The staff and children alike are being encouraged to discover new authors and try new books. It was great to hear positive feedback on this in the Parents' Forum. Marvellous Musicians

This week year 1 and 2 followed story boards that they had made and used instruments to tell a story. They used their knowledge of dynamics (volume), timbre (quality of sound) and tempo to tell the story of how each character felt.







As part of their unit on Holi- the festival colour, Class 3 have been creating vocal compositions based on artists' work. They had to work together to layer sounds and consider pitch, tempo and looping.







Bikenbility

Children in year 6 took part in Bike Ability last week. During the course, children spent time learning: how to check their bikes are safe; how to ride safely on the road; how to approach junctions; and signs and symbols of the highway code. Fun with Science

Year 1 and 2 have been experimenting with different materials to see how they can change shape.

Year 1 used their knowledge of properties to describe what was happening to the materials as they

bent, squashed, stretched, and twisted them. Year 2 conducted an experiment to see if the materials shape could be changed, making predictions, and discussing if these changes could be reversed or not.







Class 4 were lucky enough to receive a visit from Mrs Pearson this week to support their science learning about teeth. They looked at the importance of tooth hygiene and life as a dentist. An enormous thank you to Mrs Pearson for giving up your time.







Class 4's visit reminded us that breaktime snacks should be healthy (no crisps or sugary snacks) and children should only drink water through the day.

Safeguarding at KGB


