Science in and out of the Classroom


Budding scientists across the school have been using their exploration and investigative skills this week. In Wisdom of the Woods sessions,. Year Six have been learning about filtration using natural materials which consolidated last terms learning. In class they have been exploring circuits. Years 3,4 and 5 have been investigating forces and how friction can affect movement.

Last week in Science Year 1 and Year 2 went on a material hunt as an introduction to their new topic. They found lots of materials and discussed their properties and even considered what it would be like if items in the classroom were made of different materials, e.g. Jelly!





Parents/ carers are invited to attend a training Event on Social Stories, a powerful tool in supporting children on the autistic spectrum.

YES@ Areté Learning Trust is hosting a half-day training event on Social Stories on Friday, 26th January, led by Lynn McCann, the esteemed author of "Stories that Explain," a comprehensive book of Social Stories specifically designed for children.

Lynn McCann's training session will cover a wide range of topics, including the development of self-care skills (e.g., teeth cleaning, handwashing, getting dressed), enhancement of social skills (e.g., sharing, asking for help, expressing gratitude, managing interruptions), and academic abilities. Social stories can also serve as a behavioural strategy, guiding individuals on what to do when angry or how to cope with obsessions.
