One of the questions the parents asked at the Parents' Forum was about how we reward superstars, good behaviour, politeness etc in our school. Each class has their own system but as as school we:

- Award 'Growth Points' for a growth mindset. This includes challenging themself, resilience, perseverance and working hard to improve. 10 points=a leaf to put on our special tree.
- -Each class has a star of the week. They receive a golden sticker and their name gets put on our award grid for a chance to win a special prize.
- -House Points. These can be given for a variety of reasons. This might be as simple as holding a door open, sitting smartly or working hard. In our celebration worship each week these get counted up for pompoms- the winning team each team gets a reward of hot chocolate or ice lollies! Each child with the most house points in each class also gets their name on our reward grid.
