Parent's View Feedback

Thank you to all parents and carers who completed our recent questionnaire. We received 62 responses and are delighted that the vast majority of feedback was very positive.

Shining Scientists

In Science this week, children across the school have been busy carrying out exciting investigations and practical learning.

Year 1 completed an experiment to discover which material would make the best curtains for Teddy Bear. The children shone torches through a range of materials to test which ones blocked out the light most effectively, recording their observations and explaining their choices.

Year 2 carried out a fascinating investigation into which liquids are best (and worst!) for our teeth. Using eggs to represent tooth enamel, the children tested different drinks and observed the effects over time. It was very clear that water was the best drink for keeping our teeth healthy- check out the video below!

Years 3 and 4 explored forces, investigating how objects move on different surfaces. They made predictions and tested how pushes and pulls affect movement, developing their understanding of friction and speed.

Year 5 have created some fabulous songs based on classification!

Year 6 have been learning about the circulatory system. They created excellent models of blood, using Cheerios and marshmallows to represent different blood cells, helping them understand how blood travels around the body and carries vital substances.

Well done to all our young scientists for their enthusiasm, teamwork and brilliant scientific thinking!

Please find below some information we have been asked to pass on:

2. Dog fouling at the Sports Club

Following continued incidents of dog mess being found on the playing surfaces, the club need to enforce the following rules to avoid the health risks and unpleasant nature of coming into contact with dog mess.

1. Exercising dogs is permitted on the recreational field only (the field behind the club house).
2. Exercising dogs is strictly prohibited on the cricket field and football field - no exceptions.
3. No dogs are allowed to roam freely without owner in close supervision.
4. Dog walking during the hours of darkness is not permitted.
5. All dog mess must be picked up and put in the dog waste big provided (please don't dispose in the normal sports club bins at the clubhouse).
