We are so proud of each and every one of our Year 6 pupils. This week, they shone not just for themselves but for each other — and we know they'll carry these special memories with them for a long time to come.




















Children in Rising Stars have been busy designing their own flip flops ready for the sunny summer days ahead.

NSPCC's 'Speak out. Stay safe! Programme

I am pleased to inform you that we are participating in the **NSPCC**'s *Speak out. Stay safe*. **Programme** this term. *Speak out. Stay safe*. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children aged 6-7 and 9-11. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy. The workshops will take place next half term for pupils in Year 2, Year 5 and Year 6.
