Overview of Funding Use

Our PE and Sport Premium funding is used to:

- Increase pupil participation in physical activity and sport
- Improve staff confidence and subject knowledge in PE
- Broaden the range of sporting opportunities available
- Promote inclusion for disadvantaged pupils and targeted groups

Key Priorities & Spending

1. Quality of Teaching and Staff Development

Investment in CPD and external coaching support.

Impact: Increased staff confidence and improved PE provision across the school.

2. Increasing Participation in Physical Activity

Free or subsidised after-school clubs and outdoor adventurous activities particularly for disadvantaged pupils.

Impact: Increased participation in physical activity and extracurricular clubs.

3. Targeted Provision

Girls' sport initiatives and support for disadvantaged pupils.

Impact: Improved access and inclusion.

4. Broadening Sporting Opportunities

Wider range of sports offered.

Impact: Broader and more equal experience for pupils.

5. Competitive Sport

Increased opportunities for competition.

Impact: Increased participation in competitive sport, supported further by the PE lead



organising and running highly successful cluster events, leading to a significant increase in competitive opportunities. (No impact financially as cluster schools invoiced)

Additional Impact and Leadership

The PE lead has taken on responsibility for organising and running cluster sporting events. This has been highly successful, significantly increasing the number of competitive opportunities available to pupils and strengthening inter-school sport.

The school has also funded an outdoor initiative designed to support vulnerable pupils. This has helped to improve engagement, wellbeing and inclusion through targeted physical activity opportunities.

Overall Impact of Funding

The funding has led to increased physical activity levels, improved attainment in PE, increased participation, and enhanced staff development. Overall impact is positive.

Swimming and Water Safety (Year 6)

89% of pupils can swim 25m.

79% can use a range of strokes.

53% can perform safe self-rescue.

Impact: No significant impact identified from funding on swimming outcomes.

Sustainability

Staff CPD supports long-term improvements, and leadership of cluster events builds sustainable competitive opportunities across the partnership. Sustainability impact will continue to be reviewed and strengthened.
