Wisdom of The Woods

We are excited that this year we will be able to enhance our curriculum through 'Wisdom of the Woods'. Each class will have the opportunity throughout the year to take part on a Friday afternoon. Teachers will be working closely with David to plan these sessions, which will not only develop their personal, social and survival skills but will also enrich and enhance other areas of the curriculum taught in school such as their geography, technology and science units of work. This term Year 6 will be working on a special project about sustainability whilst also revisiting and consolidating their knowledge and learning from class.

After School Club

We will also be running an after school club on Friday nights for Y1-6. Currently we are looking at Y5/6 in the first term, Y3/4 in the second and Y1/2 in the third term. However, this will depend on numbers and these groups may have to be adjusted. You will receive more information at the appropriate point of the year.
