Greek performance

Parents and carers were treated to a Greek show this week when Years 3,4 and 5 brought their half term's 'Ancient Greek' topic to an end in style. They told key knowledge about Ancient Greece (for example Greek gods, numbers, architecture and philosophy) through songs, information, music and actions. The adults were then invited to the classrooms where they could see some of the work that they had done and enjoyed some Greek nibbles too.







Pentecost Journey Day

The whole school joined in on a 'Pentecost Journey Day' this week when each class looked at this special day in a different way. Reception learned that the disciples could miraculously speak and understand different languages and learned how to say 'Hello' in many ways.

Year 1 read and watched the Pentecost story and thought about how the people would be feeling. They discussed 'wonder' questions and created human sculptures to show the feelings.



Year 2 filled empty buckets (symbolising the emptiness of the disciples when Jesus was not there) with symbols of Pentecost showing that the arrival of the Holy Spirit filled them with peace and

joy.

Year 3 wrote about things they do that are kind and things they do and say that are not. They then ripped up the unkind things representing the Holy Spirit bringing good news and the values of Christianity.

Year 4 Retold the Pentecost story through drama and created storyboards.

Year 5 created special bookmarks to tell the story and reflected also on how saying lovely things to each other brings the 'warmth' of the Holy Spirt.

Year 6 used art to represent the different ways that the Holy Spirit is represented in the Bible. The school then came together in a special worship to share their thinking and what they had learned.
